



Updating of regulation

• As per University notification No.Ex/RP/Permission/2013-14 Dated: 14.11.2013, the students who have completed their courses and could not complete their degree are permitted to appear for II,IV and VI Semester examinations as one time measure subject to the condition that ,

- i) They shall have passed at least 50% of the subjects course papers in each semester,
- ii) They shall study and pass the examinations/subjects as per the existing syllabus only.

For BA/B.Sc/B.Com/BBM/BVA/BHM, students register number starting with 04 & onwards are eligible to appear for the II, IV & VI Semester examination.

For BCA Course-students who have admitted during 2000 & onwards are eligible to appear for the II, IV & VI Semester examination in the existing syllabus.

- The Academic Council has taken a decision to abolish the Internal Assessment marks [I.A] and introduce grading system in its place. Internal Assessment will be done by grading system only i.e.,
 - A- Outstanding,
 - B- Very Good,
 - C-Good,
 - D- Satisfactory,
 - E- Poor/ Unsatisfactory.
- Provision is made for rejection of results of all the subjects of a Semester only once, if the candidate decides to reappear for all the subjects of that semester. Such rejection should be made within 30 days of announcement of result, by making a written application, through the Head of the Institution. 
